


MS Fram

Reykjavik

We arrived at the port of Reykjavik at different times in the afternoon and embarked on board MS Fram to start our journey. We settled in our cabins, explored the ship and picked up our expedition jackets. Our Expedition Leader Tomski gave us information about our voyage and Alicia our

Expedition Coordinator gave us information about the excursions we can join. Before we went sleeping after a long and exciting day, we met the captain, officers and the expedition team during the evening. Some of us were out on deck when we started sailing.





Stykkisholmur

After our first night at sea we arrived at the Westcoast of Iceland in Stykkisholmur. For the first time we went ashore with the tender boats of MS Fram. Our adventure started with lots of excursion choices. Some explored the highlights of Snaefellsnes while others explored the caves, craters and

coves of this part of Iceland. Some of us explored on their own this charming place at Iceland's Westcoast. In the afternoon we were visited by a local performer and enjoyed his music in the explorer lounge.





Patreksfjordur

During the night we sailed further towards the North and arrived in the morning at Patreksfjordur. Some of us explored the Latrabjarg Cliff while others went on the excursion called the "splendid combination" where we saw a beautiful waterfall called Dynjandi. After we set sail we joined the


Grimsey

The island was literally covered in birds and we saw a lot of puffins, arctic terns and also the lovely singing snow buntings while we followed the coastline

trail. The puffins were hovering in the wind, what a unique experience! The wind was picking up a lot during the landing and our Expedition Leader made the decicion to leave the island earlier. Safety First! We left Iceland and started sailing towards North, to Jan Mayen.

At Sea - Jun 4, 2024 536.6 km


At Sea

Bamsebu, Svalbard


Due to our good progress we arrived half a day earlier on Svalbard and this gave us the opportunity to enjoy one more landing on Svalbard. We sailed into Bellsund in the South of the main island, called Spitsbergen. Before we went ashore we learned from our Expedition Leader about the Polar Bear Safety. In the afternoon we went on land at a place called

Bamsebu, which is the only place on Svalbard where it is possible to see remains from the Beluga whale hunting period of the 1930s. We all went for a stroll on shore and we also spotted reindeer and lots of geese, eider ducks and snow buntings. What a lovely start in the high Arctic.

This morning we woke up in an Arctic Paradise! The view out of the windows showed an extremely calm ocean, snow covered mountains, a blue sky and groups of Guillemots flying around the ship. A landscape like an oil painting. MS Fram anchored infront of a beautiful glacier, called Lilliehøøkbreen and we went on a wonderful cruise infront of the glacier, where we spotted lots of icebergs and birds. In

the afternoon we landed at a place called Signehamna, which is located in Krossfjorden. We went with the small boats ashore and discovered this picturesque place and learned about the German Weather Stations, that were located here during the Second World War. In the evening we sadly started our way to Longyearbyen, where our voyage will end in the morning.
