




## Science Boat and Fjordphyto

On our voyage we conducted 12 Science Boats during which we collected Secchi disc measurements, CTD data, plankton samples, and hydrophone recordings.

We also collected samples for the citizen science project FjordPhyto in 4 different locations in Antarctica. To learn more about FjordPhyto, please click here.

The abundance and diversity of plankton was exceptional, especially the amount of silica based phytoplankton (called diatoms) in some areas within the Antarctic Peninsula.









#### Happywhale

A large number of whales were seen this voyage. We were able to submit photos of nine individual humpback whale flukes to Happywhale. Many of the humpbacks are new individuals that have never before been recorded, but one of these whales has been seen 15 times in total since February 2024, always around the same area of the Antarctic Peninsula and another whale was spotted only one other time in Ecuador last September, probably about to leave her breeding ground to come to Antarctica to feed.











## Guest scientists

Prof. Marcos Santos, from the University of São Paulo (Brazil), embarked on an expedition aboard MS Fram, traveling through the Falklands, South Georgia, and the Antarctic Peninsula to launch a groundbreaking initiative: building a free-access global sound library. This project, Sounds Good! Science, Education, and Art Inspired by the Mother Nature Serenade, aims to capture and share the voices of our planet—both species (bioacoustics) and entire ecosystems (soundscapes)—with scientists, educators, students, artists, and all who cherish nature's symphony. In this inaugural expedition, he recorded 185 unique sound files across 14 diverse locations, amassing over seven hours of natural acoustic data. These recordings mark the first steps in an ambitious effort to preserve, study, and inspire through the universal language of sound.



## Guest scientists


We had the privilege of hosting Lucy Babey and Ruth Coxon from ORCA, one of the UK's leading whale and dolphin conservation charities. Lucy and Ruth have been on board conducting some exciting whale research for a project that is monitoring recovering whale populations in the Southern Ocean. Lucy and Ruth have been carrying out their scientific surveys from the bridge of the ship and the data collected will help better understand the abundance and distribution of large whales around South Georgia and the Antarctic Peninsula. During their surveys a total of 1,398 individual animals were recorded from 11 different whale and dolphin species.


