Science & Education Program

Our Science and Education Team accompanied you during your expedition to the remote communities and impressive nature of the islands of Scotland's Hebrides.

We had the opportunity to explore our destination's natural beauty, exceptional wildlife, and rich history. We organized lectures and interactive activities onboard and explored our destinations during excursions, nature walks, and from the water.

History & Culture

We had the unique chance to see some remainings of the many different influences affecting this Isles. Celtic, Pict, Christian and Norse culture merge in the language, architecture and way of life on the Hebrides and enrich the history of settlement, conquests, clan fights, independence uprises and highland clearance.

We learnt more about the saga of conquest, survival, adaptation, and resilience that the Hebrides represent




Arts & Crafts

NASA Globe Cloud Observer

Together with our Environmental Scientist Jean you observed the clouds and submitted your observations to NASA GLOBE Observer on 2 occasions.

Interestingly, the observation we made “from the ground” on April 15th did not quite match the METEOSAT-10 observations, especially in the mid- to low-cloud altitudes. And yet, that is exactly why we do those observations, to complement satellite data and feed the climate and weather models.

These cloud observations can help NASA improve our understanding of Earth’s atmosphere and climate by providing valuable data for scientific research and climate modelling.

iNaturalist

Throughout our expedition, we documented the flora and fauna of the Scottish Isles and uploaded all our findings to the iNaturalist biodiversity platform.

During our voyage, we submitted 159 observations of 81 different species. This effort contributes to the creation of a comprehensive understanding of the geographical distribution of species and can aid researchers in their ongoing studies and conservation efforts to protect them.

Science Boat

22 eager participants joined our 3 Science Boats in Gigha, Tobermory and Colonsay to study plankton and the hydrography of our destination.

They helped monitor ocean clarity through participation in the Secchi Disk citizen science study, contributing to important research on the distribution of phytoplankton blooms.




Plankton Samples

We explored the microscopic world of plankton, the tiny organisms that drift in our ocean.

In the plankton samples collected from Gigha, we found mainly zooplankton, whereas our sample from Tobermory was dominated by various species of diatoms, the most abundant type of phytoplankton.


During our open microscope session, we also observed various types of zooplankton, such as the copepods [1,2] and planktonic gastropod [3] captured in the picture.



Underwater Drone

We deployed our Blueye Pioneer underwater drone to explore the underwater world of the British Isles and demonstrate the ROVs capabilities in the Isle of Eigg.

Beach Clean-up

Many of you demonstrated your dedication to protecting nature by taking part in our organised beach cleans. This voyage was also the first to pioneer new citizen science sampling techniques as part of the “Big Blue Bag” citizen science project, founded by TV presenter and Marine Biologist Monty Halls

Working alongside Monty, we removed approximately **30kg** of litter from beaches on the Islands of Islay and Vatersay, whilst also carrying out some sand sampling to identify microplastic pollution. A huge thank you to all those involved!

Guest Lecturer

TV broadcaster and marine conservationist Monty Halls joined us to share his experiences of living in the Hebrides. He also pioneered his new conservation project the Big Blue Bag, supported by the HX Foundation, for the first time! During our voyage the first of the bags was delivered to a local community in Stornoway.
