
Longyearbyen - Our Starting Point and the Gateway to the Arctic!


Hornsund - Burgerbukta

The new day began pleasantly with a warm breakfast and the steady blossoming of acquaintance and friendship among guests. After a morning briefing on the day's plans, guests enjoyed lunch. Soon after, the expedition team set out to scout the proposed landing site at Burgerbukta. However, a bear was spotted nearby, and for safety reasons, the landing was cancelled. Instead, the afternoon was spent

cruising by ship. Not long into the voyage, a bear was spotted on the sea ice. Many guests were able to observe this magnificent creature through binoculars or even with the naked eye. Additionally, the expedition team provided a live video feed of the bear on the ship's TVs using a highly advanced remotely operated camera system.








Bellsund - A visit to Bamsebu and Calypsobyen

The day began with a landing at the peaceful and placid Bamsebu, where guests received their first glimpse into Svalbard's storied whaling heritage. Beluga whale bones littered the beach, and a stark, stoic hunting cabin loomed at the foot of the mountains. In the afternoon, we visited Calypsobyen, where guests were treated to even more vivid relics of Svalbard's complex history. Buildings here dated

back to the years directly following the First World War and were remnants of the famed Northern Exploration Company, who sought to extract coal from Svalbard's shores. Besides the fascinating relics, many guests also took in the glorious landscape on a hike provided by the activity guides.



















Magdalenefjorden - Gravneset

On this day, guests had the chance to experience the saga-enveloped Gravneset, one of Svalbard's most storied sites. Its vivid, jagged beauty captivated many. As they walked along the beach, guests came across stark reminders of Svalbard's whaling past: the ruins of

blubber ovens and the many graves scattered across the hilly outcrop of the peninsula. Further along, they were able to gaze out over the ice-strewn bay, framed by the towering mountains of the fjord.








Moffen Island - 80 degrees north and above!

This day was an adventure filled with spontaneity. In the morning, we had the opportunity to view the highly protected nature reserve of Moffen Island, located in Svalbard's high north. Walruses were spotted hauled out on the shore, while gulls circled overhead. Later in the afternoon, we reached our highest northerly latitude of 80

degrees and 26 minutes. To celebrate this milestone, guests were treated to a delicious cup of hot chocolate - complete with a little extra dash of liquid courage - as we sat in the boundless, freezing ocean, surrounded by ice.


















Smeerenburg – No Walruses, but Scenic Glacier Cruising!














Ny-Ålesund - The most northern settlement in the world!
















Longyearbyen - Disembarkation
