


Day 1 - Embarkation in Hamburg



Day 2 - Harlingen, The Netherlands

Visiting Harlingen offers a charming glimpse into a traditional Dutch port town with a rich maritime history. One of the highlights of the stop is taking a Zodiac cruise through the town's historic canal system, providing a unique and up-close perspective of its picturesque waterways. Gliding past old warehouses, sailing ships, and quaint

brick buildings, guests get a sense of the town's deep connection to the sea. The small, agile Zodiacs allow for an intimate experience, navigating narrow canals that larger boats can't access, making it a memorable way to explore Harlingen from the water.











Day 3 - Ostend, Belgium

A stop in Ostend offers a convenient gateway to the beautiful city of Bruges, known for its medieval architecture, winding canals, and historic charm. Unfortunately, due to a sea pilot strike on the day of arrival, the visit was delayed, resulting in a shorter stay than originally planned. Despite the limited time, guests were still able to enjoy a



Day 5 - Saint Malo

Visiting St. Malo by ship offers a captivating introduction to Brittany's rugged charm and maritime history. As our ship passed through the Lock and docked near the ancient walled city, you're greeted by granite ramparts and narrow cobbled streets steeped in pirate lore. A guided walking tour through St. Malo reveals its rich past—from the corsair stronghold to the Gothic Saint-Vincent Cathedral—and offers


time to explore its bustling markets and sea-view cafes. From there, an excursion to the iconic Mont Saint-Michel provides a stunning contrast, as you travel through scenic countryside to the dramatic tidal island crowned by a medieval abbey. Exploring the winding paths and sweeping views of Mont Saint-Michel is an unforgettable highlight of this journey through northern France.











Day 6 - Douarnenez

Arriving in Douarnenez offers a charming glimpse into Brittany's maritime soul, with its colorful fishing boats and historic harbor steeped in sardine fishing heritage. Once ashore, walking through the town reveals its coastal charm, from the lively quaysides to the maritime museum housed in an old cannery. From Douarnenez, an excursion to Quimper allows visitors to explore the cultural heart of

Cornouaille, with its half-timbered houses, quaint cobblestone streets, and the impressive Gothic Cathedral of Saint-Corentin. Some also had a visit to the dramatic Pointe du Raz, where windswept cliffs offer breathtaking views of the Atlantic Ocean and the untamed beauty of Brittany's westernmost point—an awe-inspiring end to a day of discovery.

Day 8 & 9 - Ferrol

Arriving in Ferrol, Spain by ship offers a unique and scenic introduction to this historic naval city in Galicia. Once ashore, visitors could enjoy guided walking tours through Ferrol's charming old town, exploring its maritime heritage, elegant neoclassical architecture, and lively local markets. A short journey away, the vibrant city of A Coruña awaited with its famous Tower of Hercules—the oldest working Roman

lighthouse in the world—offering stunning coastal views. Walking tours through A Coruña's old quarter revealed a rich blend of history and culture, while other excursions in the surrounding region showcase Galicia's rugged cliffs, lush countryside, and quaint fishing villages, making for a diverse and memorable experience along Spain's northwestern coast.

Day 10 - Vigo

Arriving in Vigo unfolded with two parallel excursions that showcased both the city's historic charm and the region's natural beauty. Many spent the morning on a walking tours through the atmospheric streets of the Casco Vello, exploring its narrow alleys, lively squares, and landmarks like the O Berbés market and Monte O Castro, which offered panoramic views over the Ría de Vigo and the harbor. At the same time, another group set off by boat to the Cíes Islands, part of


the Atlantic Islands of Galicia National Park. There, they hiked along scenic coastal trails and enjoyed time on Rodas Beach, famed for its white sand and crystal-clear waters. In the afternoon, both groups reunited back in Vigo, sharing stories of their different experiences—one rooted in the city's rich history, the other in the stunning natural landscapes just offshore.











Day 11 - Porto

We arrived in Porto on our very last stop in some dense fog but nevertheless the day offered two distinct ways to experience the city's rich character. Many spent the morning on a walking tour through the historic center, wandering the cobbled streets of the Ribeira district, admiring the colorful tiled buildings, and visiting landmarks such as the São Bento railway station and Porto Cathedral. Meanwhile,

another group enjoyed a scenic river cruise along the Douro, gliding beneath the city's iconic bridges and taking in panoramic views of the hillside architecture and bustling waterfront. In the afternoon, everyone still had free time to enjoy the charm of Porto's streets and history.
