

The First Norsemen in Greenland




reconstructed longhouse one could really get a sense of how the early Norsemen in Greenland lived. We also saw the very first Catholic church built in Greenland.











Carvings on the Rocks and the Northern Lights








An Introduction to Labrador









Perfect U-Shaped Fjords


Pine-Like Scent, Black Bears, and Polar Bears


Ramah Bay




Moravians History and a Polar Bear

naturalists and historians also gave insightful talks about the region's nature and history.




Proud History


Basque Whalers

past, while the town's warm, small-community charm — and their visit with the lighthouse keeper — made the experience even more memorable.








Leif Erikson

Local Festivities


We were lucky to visit this town on the day they held a local festival, so there were moose burgers, live music, pumpkin contests, and so much more for our guests to experience. Those who explored the
